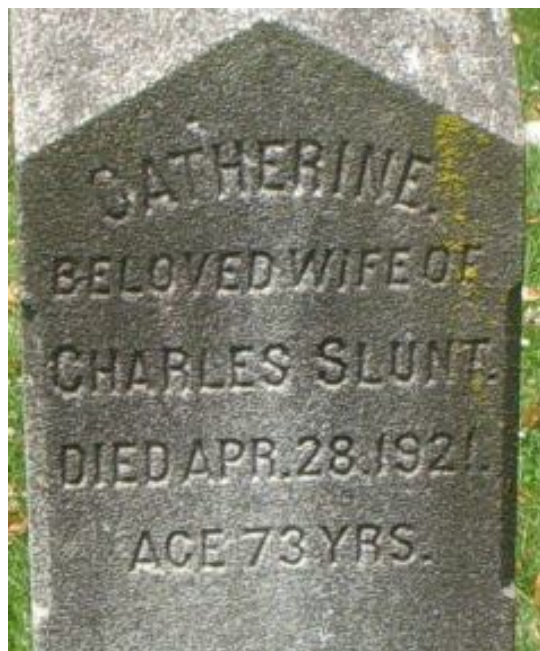


The SLUNT Family – New Cathedral Cemetery, Baltimore, MD
Section K: North ½ of Lot 83

Catherine Coffay Slunt was the second daughter of **John** and **Catherine Coffay** and the half-sister of **William Manion**. She was born in Roscommon Parish, Ireland, and is buried with her husband, **Charles Slunt**, and six of their nine children at New Cathedral Cemetery, Baltimore. The first member of the family to be buried was Mary Slunt in 1885 at age 13. Her name is engraved on one side of the memorial. Two other sides have the names of Catherine and Charles.

James Slunt – Most Holy Redeemer Cemetery, Baltimore, Maryland

James M. G. Slunt was the youngest child of Charles Slunt & Catherine Coffay. He married **Eva Marie Franz** in 1919. They had two children, and then James died in 1927 at the young age of 33 years. He was buried in his wife’s family lot at **Most Holy Redeemer Cemetery** at Moravia & Belair Roads in Baltimore, Maryland.

There are other members of the Franz family buried in this lot and also in the adjacent Koenig family lot. **Eva Marie (Franz) Slunt** married Robert Pruett sometime after 1930, and she is buried in Parkwood Cemetery on Taylor Ave. in Parkville, Maryland.

Rose Slunt was one of the six daughters of **Charles Slunt & Catherine Coffay**. Rose married **Albert Clayton** of Monmouth County, New Jersey, in 1908. The Claytons settled in Monmouth County and raised five children. Rose (Slunt) Clayton was interred at St. Catherine’s Cemetery, Sea Girt, in Monmouth County, New Jersey.

Note: Charles & Catherine Slunt’s first daughter, Mary, died in 1885. They named another daughter, Mary, born in 1890. There is no death or burial information, as of yet, for the 2nd Mary.
