Thomas Lee lived with Bridget and Catherine Coffay at the time of the fire on York Road. After the fire, the three moved to this address which was a multi-family dwelling in Remington, just west of Sisson St. Bridget's mother Catherine died the previous year, so Bridget was became guardian to her nephew, Thomas. Bridget's occupation (dairy) tells us that she and her mother continued on with their dairy business even after the fire on York Road.

The following year, Bridget's niece, **Stella Mannion**, moved nearby to the 400 block of 26th street, with her husband, **Stephen Gunther**.

I think these were errors made

by the Little Sisters of the Poor who had to fill in the form.²
