

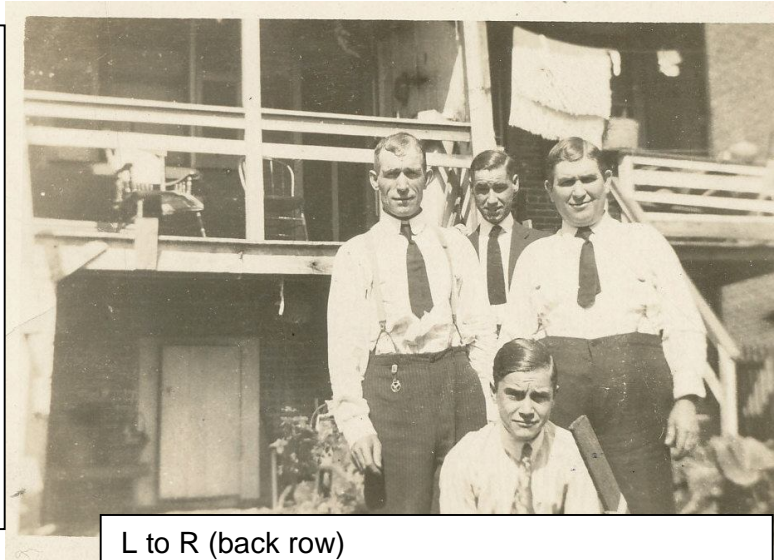
Mary Ann Sacks Family Gallery

This photograph at right is believed to have been taken in the back yard of **Henry & Mary Ann Sacks'** home in June 1916. The Sacks were living at #1950 Ridgewood Ave., Baltimore, MD.

Mary Ann's father, **William Manion**, died on June 11th and the funeral took place in the Sacks' home on June 14th.

Mary Ann's brother, Frank Manion, traveled from Philadelphia with his son, John, to attend the funeral

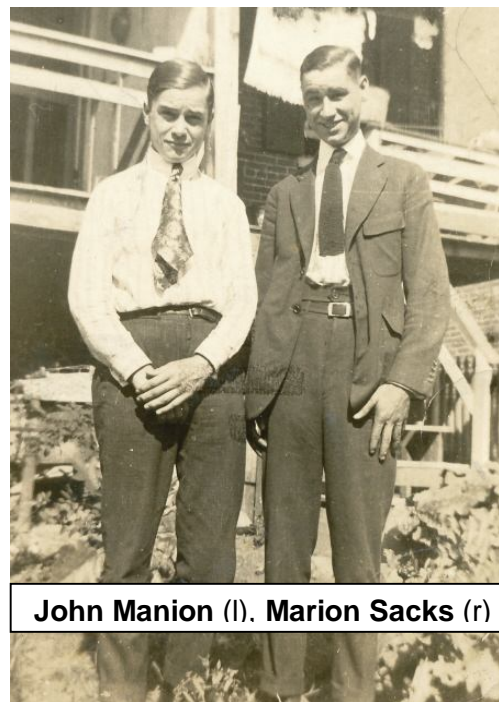

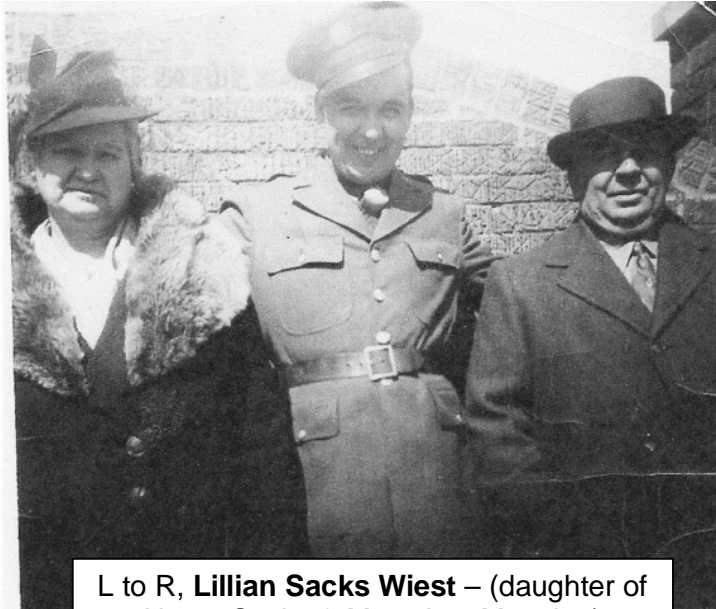

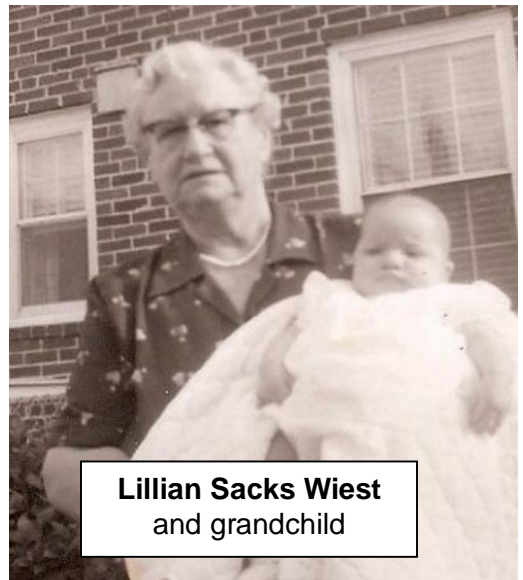

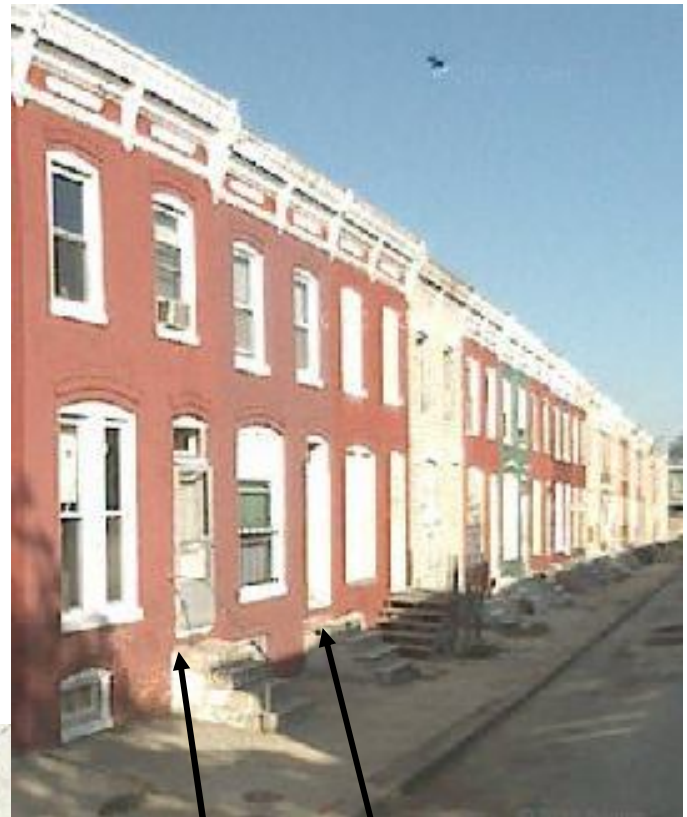

Mary Ann Mannion & Henry Sacks began their married life on Mount Royal (Grasshopper) Hill, across the street from Mary Ann's family. They moved to Florence Street (an alley street), and then to Woodyear Street on the same block as Henry Sacks' parents.

By the year 1901 they were living at **#1948 Ridgewood Avenue** in a newly developed area of West Baltimore, just north of North Avenue & south of where Mondawmin Mall is today.

By the year 1908, the Sacks family moved into the house next door at **#1950 Ridgewood Ave.** (today it is called Ridgehill) and stayed at that location until 1922..
As the Sacks children became adults, most of them continued to live on the same block or nearby.



Bessie Sacks Hissey lived at #1904 and #1944 Ridgewood Ave. and also at 1933 Clifton.

William Henry Sacks lived at #2013 Ridgewood, then at # 2009 Ridgewood

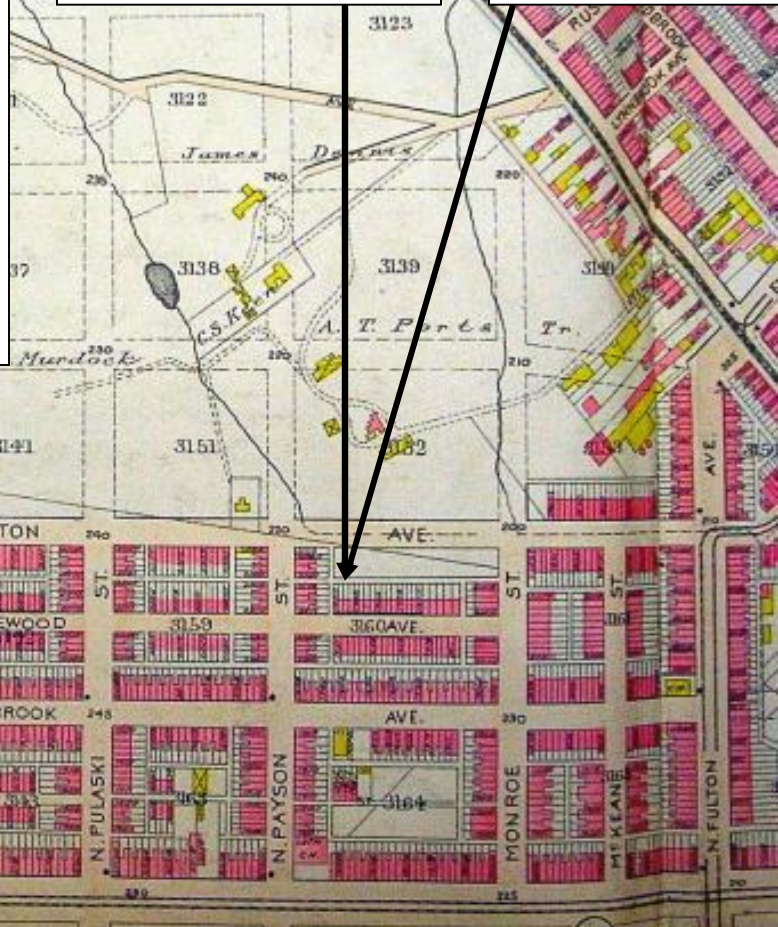
Mary Sacks Koehler lived at 1926 Ridgewood, then at 1535 Clifton. Her brother **Marion Sacks** also lived at 1535 Clifton.

Lillian Sacks Wiest lived at #1943 Clifton, #2113 Clifton, and #2121 Clifton. Her sister, **Birdie Sacks** also lived at #2121 Clifton.

Melvin Sacks lived at #1620 N. Smallwood.

By 1923, Mary Ann & Henry Sacks moved to #1519 Retreat Street, Baltimore, MD. The house was adjacent to the car barn of the United Railways & Electric Company, where Henry Sacks was employed as a streetcar driver. Mary Ann Mannion Sacks died at this location in 1925.
