







Alice O'Hara Manning Widow of John T Manning (Formerly Mannion)

By the end of 1915, (the year of John Manning's death) John and Alice had moved from Pinckney place to 424 E. Lanvale which was a half block north of Pinckney. The Mannings were having marital troubles at this time and John moved to a boarding house in downtown Baltimore near where he was working as a horseshoer. After John's death, Alice had to depend on her children for support. She lived at several locations with her son, William Manning.



In 1923, Alice's daughter, **Margaret Manning Moriarty**, became the widow of **Daniel J. Luby**.
They owned a home at 424 E. 21<sup>st</sup> St., and Alice moved there with Margaret for several years. William Manning, Margaret's brother, also lived at this address.

Margaret Manning Moriarty Luby married a third time to P. J. William Severin. They settled in the Ednor Gardens area of Baltimore at 972 North Hill Rd. As of 1942, Alice Manning was living at this address with the Severins.



Sometime after 1942, Alice Manning returned to the St. Ann's Parish neighborhood and remained there until her death in 1959. Alice's last address was 2452 Greenmount Avenue. Alice's son, William Manning, was also living on Greenmount Avenue in the 2600 block.
