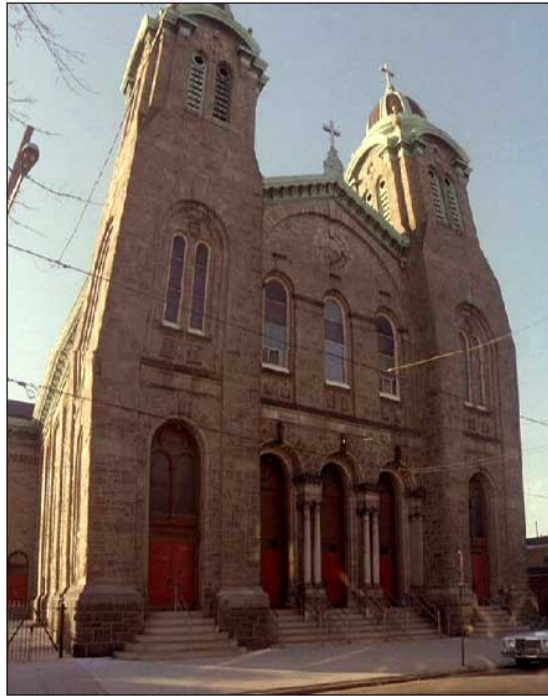
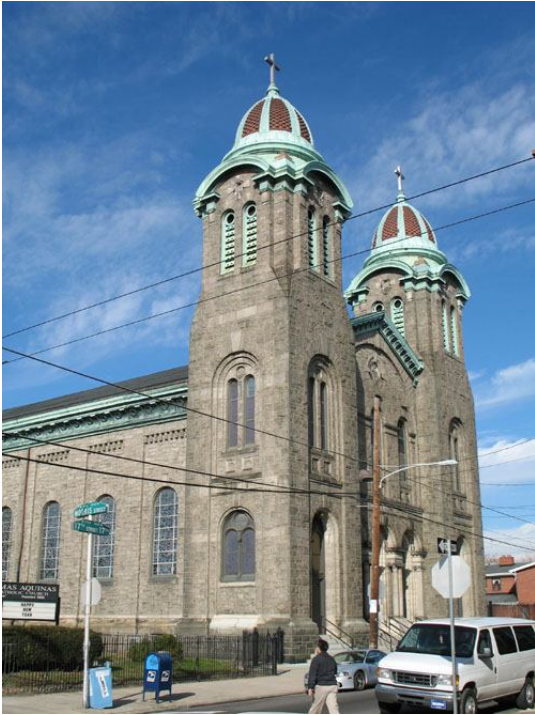


## St. Thomas Aquinas Parish, Morris Street, Philadelphia, PA

Frank met Mary McGoey, an Irish immigrant from County Longford, and they raised seven children in South Philadelphia. Their parish was St. Thomas Aquinas at 1719 Morris St in South Philadelphia. All of their children were baptized there.
