

St. Gregory the Great, N. Gilmor St., Baltimore, MD

By the 1890s, our ancestors began moving beyond the Mount Royal “Grasshopper” Hill area into other parishes. Mary Mannion Sacks and her family settled in a newly developed area in west Baltimore in the vicinity of St. Gregory the Great parish. The Sacks’ first two children were baptized at Corpus Christi and the rest at St. Gregory’s. William and Agnes Mannion also lived in the parish for a few years.



St. Gregory the Great Roman Catholic Church was at 1542 N. Gilmor Street in West Baltimore. The photo above is the church today. This current building may have been the original parish school. The original church is gone.

1890 Baptism - **Mary Catherine Sacks**, daughter of **Mary Ann Mannion** and **Henry Sacks**
Godparents: John **Mannion/Manning** (her uncle) and **Emma Slunt**

1891 Baptism - **William Michael Mannion**, son of **William Mannion** and Agnes **Mooney**
Godparents: **Francis Manion** (his uncle, brother of William Mannion) & **Anna Dailey**

1892 Baptism - **Frank Sacks**, son of **Mary Ann Mannion** and **Henry Sacks**
Godparent: **Edward Dervis** & **Mary B. Brown** (Frank’s aunt; sister of **Mary Coyle Manion**)

1895 Baptism - **Lillian Sacks** daughter of **Mary Ann Mannion** and **Henry Sacks**
Godparent: **Mary Lee Kelly** (Lillian’s cousin, daughter of **Mary Coffay** and **Thomas Lee**)

1916 Requiem Mass - **William Manion** - Husband of **Mary Coyle** – Father of **William Mannion**, Mary Ann **Sacks**, Catherine **Mannion**, John T. **Manning**, Michael **Manion**, Frank **Manion**, Robert **Mannion** & Stella **Gunther** - Son of **Catherine Coffay**.

1921 Requiem Mass – **Catherine Slunt**, wife of **Charles Slunt** & daughter of **John Coffay** & **Catherine Hanley**

1925 Requiem Mass – **Mary Ann Sacks**, wife of Henry Sacks & daughter of **William** and **Mary Manion**
