They conducted a dairy farm until the death of the old man from pneumonia, which occurred last week.

		But Mrs. Coffay , is cooperative with requests made by the Baltimore and Potomac Railroad Company to which the land (a tract of about two acres) belongs, is prepared to move out and the old house will be carted away, together with the stable in the rear and the fences. The cottage is one of the most singular of edifices and always attracted notice on account of its isolated ugliness.
