NOTE: There is no specific reason for the name discrepancies. Here in the 1880 census the family name is "Manning" yet in the Baltimore City Directory of the same year it was "Manion." These many variations could possibly be the record taker's phonetic interpretations of what was heard spoken with an Irish accent. As the children became adults, each chose a specific spelling and stuck with it; Mannion, Manion or Manning.⁵

 The 77 indictments found by the grand jury against the three Supervisors of Elections and other election officials on the charge of having violated the law in connection with the municipal election last may will probably, it is thought, be settled in favor of the accused by a decision rendered yesterday morning by Judge Stockbridge in the Criminal Court. The decision of Judge Stockbridge was a verdict of not guilty in the case of **Michael A. Manion**, one of the indicted election officials. **Mr. Manion** was a Democratic judge of election in the Eleventh precinct of the Thirteenth ward, one of the four precincts in which the ballots were not counted. He was indicted, with the other judges in the precinct, for an alleged unlawful and willful neglect of duty in failing to count the ballots and in failing to make duplicate returns of the vote.
 As stated in The Sun yesterday, the case turned upon the interpretation to be put upon the word "willful" in the election law. Judge Stockbridge decided that it must be interpreted to mean that the duty required by the law to be performed was neglected because of some bad or evil motive. No such motive having been shown by the testimony in the case, **Mr. Manion** was acquitted.
Mr. Poe To Examine Testimony
 State's Attorney, **Edgar Allan Poe** said after the verdict had been rendered that he will confess not guilty in all the other cases unless there is some difference between the testimony in them and that in **Mr. Manion's** case.
