NOTE: There is no specific reason for the name discrepancies. Here in the 1880 census the family name is "Manning" yet in the Baltimore City Directory of the same year it was "Manion." These many variations could possibly be the record taker's phonetic interpretations of what was heard spoken with an Irish accent. As the children became adults, each chose a specific spelling and stuck with it; Mannion, Manion or Manning.⁶

1893 Feb 9 Death Notice: Sun Paper. Baltimore,,Maryland USA. **MANION - Kate**, in the 26th year of her age, beloved daughter of William & Mary Manion. Her funeral will take place from her late residence, number 1914 Mount Royal Hill, on Friday morning at 8 o'clock. Friends invited.⁷

NOTE: Catherine "Kate" was actually age 26, She was buried in New Cathedral Cemetery on February 10th according to the death certificate. The cemetery records have her buiral as March 31st in Lot Q, section 14, which means she was moved from another grave on that date.²

General Notes: The photograph is probably Catherine "Kate" Mannion. It was in the posession of her sister, Stella (Mannion) Gunther. There is an inscription on the back: "From your loving sister, Kate."
The photographer's studio is printed on the front as Indianapolis, Indiana. Kate's mother, Mary Coyle Manion, had relatives who settled in the Chicago area, so it's possible that Kate had traveled to the midwest to visit or for work.
