NOTE: There is no specific reason for the name discrepancies. Here in the 1880 census the family name is "Manning" yet in the Baltimore City Directory of the same year it was "Manion." These many variations could possibly be the record taker's phonetic interpretations of what was heard spoken with an Irish accent. As the children became adults, each chose a specific spelling and stuck with it; Mannion, Manion or Manning.⁵

Manion - On August 28th, 1913, **Mary**, aged sixty-three, beloved wife of **William Manion**. Funeral will take place from her late residence, Mount Vernon Ave. and Twenty-sixth street on Saturday at 8:30 A.M. thence to SS. Philip and James Church where a requiem mass will be said for the repose of her soul at 9 A.M. Interment at New Cathedral Cemetery.

NOTE: The reported address is the home of Mary's daughter, **Stella Gunther**. **Mary** must have moved in with the **Gunthers** soon after her hospitalization at St. Luke's on July 4.¹²
