He was actually 15. Passengers over 14 were listed as adults and charged a higher fare. Catherine may have given William's age as 13 to get the lower fare. William's name was listed as Coffay, which makes sense since his mother and siblings were Coffays. ⁷

1854-1859	Residence:	Texas,Baltimore County,Maryland,USA. NOTE: Bridget Coffay's (William Manion's half-sister) birthplace was recorded as Texas, Baltimore County , Maryland, on her death certificate. This would suggest that her father, John Coffay, worked in one of the Texas, MD quarries. Coffay immigrated by himself in 1850, and the rest of the family joined him in 1853. It's likely William Manion worked in a Texas quarry, also, since he was of working age, 16 - 21, during this period.

His occupation is listed as stonecutter. ²⁹

Directory of the same year it was "Manion." These many variations could possibly be the record taker's phonetic interpretations of what was heard spoken with an Irish accent. As the children became adults, each chose a specific spelling and stuck with it; Mannion, Manion or Manning.¹⁵

sponsor, John Caffay, which is probably John Coffay. John Coffay was naturalized in 1859 and his wife and children became automatic citizens. William Manion, being his step-son, was not given the privilege and had to become naturalized on his own. William's naturalization occurred almost forty years after his arrival in Maryland.²⁴

William Manning (Manion) was appointed as lamplighter by Mayor Latrobe.
NOTE:
The lamplighter position was a politically tied job. He would have to be referred to the Mayor, in writing, by a sponsor to be considered for the position. Mayor Latrobe was a Democrat.
William Manion must have been involved in Democratic club or organization. Lamplighter was a coveted position for men like William. It was a short lived career, though. The Democrats lost the next election - Latrobe was out and so were his lamplighters. The next crew was filled with Republicans.²²

NOTES: His mother's maiden name was Catherine Hanley, although was spelled "Hannonly" on the death record. This may be how the name sounded when spoken with an Irish accent..a three syllable sound...Han-a-lee, interpreted as "Hannonly" by Sister Benedict at the Little Sisters of the Poor. Realizing that Hannonly was actually Hanley, was an important clue that led me (the researcher) to finding Irish marriage and baptism records of the Manion/Mannions, Coffays and Coyles. The other main clues were; Catherine Coffay's death notice gave her birthplace as Roscommon, Ireland, and John Coffay's death notice gave his birthplace in Ireland as the village of Kiltreevan in Roscommon County. I checked the Roscommon Parish records which were available from the Roscommon Heritage Society online and on microfilm through the Mormon Family Research Center in Baltimore. The records included the marriages of Catherine Hanley to William Mannion and to John Coffay. Their childrens' baptisms were also there and the names and dates closely matched those on the US census and Baltimore church records. Address: Little Sisters of the Poor, Baltimore, Maryland³
