**William** was christened as "**Thomas Manan.**" Parents: **William Manan** and **Mary Coyle.**

**NOTE:** It's unclear why William was baptized with the name, "Thomas." Possibly, he was named after his mother's brother, **Thomas Coyle**, and then changed to William, after his father or grandfather, which was the more typical Irish naming practice.

Sponsors: William Birmingham and **Catherine Coffay.**

**Note:** William Manion Sr.'s mother and sister were both named **Catherine Coffay.**

There was a William Birmingham listed in the 1860 Baltimore City Directory. He was a stone mason and lived at 8 Booth St.

**NOTE:** There is no specific reason for the name discrepancies. Here in the 1880 census the family name is "Manning" yet in the Baltimore City Directory of the same year it was "Manion." These many variations could possibly be the record taker's phonetic interpretations of what was heard spoken with an Irish accent. As the children became adults, each chose a specific spelling and stuck with it; Mannion, Manion or Manning.<sup>7</sup>

Mary was the oldest child of John and Catherine Coffay, William Manion Sr.'s half-sister.<sup>9</sup>

The Assault & Battery charge would explain why he was committed to the House of Correction for 3 months. He may have been fighting with whoever was responsible for throwing his family and their belongings out on the street.

**HOMELESS AND HELPLESS**  
**Mrs. Agnes Mannion and Her Children Aided by Agent Parker**  
Mrs. Agnes Mannion and her two children, Winnie, aged six years, and Willie, aged four years, were turned out of their home last night on account of being in arrears for rent. They lived on the second floor of 36 West Preston street.  
A few days ago they were notified by their landlord that they would have to leave the house unless the rent was paid without delay. **Wm. Mannion**, the husband, who is a stonemason, was out of work and he was unable to raise money for the rent. After dark yesterday, a constable appeared at the house in the absence of **Mr. Mannion** and turned into the street Mrs. Mannion and her children with the small amount of furniture they own. The house is a frame building elevated a few feet from the street. Having no place to go, Mrs. Mannion took her children and her few belongings under the house, where she and her children tried to keep warm by covering themselves with rags.

Mrs. Henrietta Livingston, who lives on the first floor of the house, saw the distressed condition of her neighbors, so she went to the central police station and informed Lieutenant Rowe. He informed Agent Parker, of the Society of the Protection of Children, and the patrol wagon was sent to remove the unfortunate people to a temporary asylum.

When the patrol wagon arrived at the house it was surrounded by a crowd of hysterical women, who were trying to minister to Mrs. Mannion and her children. At first, Mrs. Mannion refused to leave the place, saying her husband would call for her in a short time. When it was explained that she would not be taken to a police station she readily assented to go to the home of Mr. Parker for the night.

She said her husband has not been at work for several weeks, but they had managed to get along until their rent amounted to \$5. They could not pay that amount, and were turned into the street in consequence. Mrs. Mannion also said she has relatives living in Baltimore, but does not know where they can be found. She is in a delicate condition.

Mr. Parker will care for the family until some permanent relief can be obtained. If it is desired, the children will be placed in some institution.<sup>14</sup>

He took an appeal from the decision of the Justice. **Mrs. Mannion** is being cared for by Mrs. Livingston, and her two children have been sent to St. Vincent's Orphan Asylum. "Cash" sends \$5 and "Anti-Monroe Doctrine" sends \$1 to The Sun office for **Mrs. Mannion** and her family. The money will be given to Marshall Frey to deliver.<sup>15</sup>

**NOTE:** William's sentence was reduced by 10 days. However, the actual amount of time he spent at the House of Correction was only 30 days. His sentencing date was Dec. 20, 1895. His reception into the House of Correction was on Feb. 10, 1896 and he was released March 10, 1896. It's unclear where William was from Dec. 20 - Feb. 10. During that period, Agnes Mannion had returned and continued to live at their West Preston Street residence, although without their children Winnie and Willie, who had been sent to St. Vincent's Home. Two days after William Mannion's release from prison, Agnes gave birth to their son, John Mannion, on March 12, 1896. Tragically, the baby died the same day.

**NOTE:** The infant child was **John J. Mannon**, who was three months old at this point. There is no mention of the other two children, **Winifred** and **Willie**. Their grandparents; William & Mary Manion, great-grandparents; John & Catherine Coffay, along with several aunts, uncles & cousins, were all living on Grasshopper Hill, so the children could have been staying with any of them.
