

Michael Coyle was from Roscommon County, Ireland. He married Anne Tarpey in 1835 and they settled in Roscommon Town, County Roscommon, Ireland, where they had at least seven children. Several of the Coyle children emigrated to Baltimore, Maryland in the 1850s and 1860s. Michael Coyle also emigrated to Baltimore from Roscommon, Ireland, when he was close to eighty years old.

In Baltimore, Michael Coyle lived with his youngest daughter, **Mary B. (Coyle) Brown**, and her family. He is buried in New Cathedral Cemetery in the family lot of his oldest child, **Mary (Coyle) Manion**.

Michael Coyle's second daughter was **Catherine "Kate" Coyle**, She married John Killien in about 1865 and they had one son, **John P. Killien**. Catherine later married **Frederick Frissel** (the name was changed to Fissel) in about 1868 and they had three children. The Fissels are buried in New Cathedral Cemetery, Section W - Lot 292. There is no visible marker in the lot.

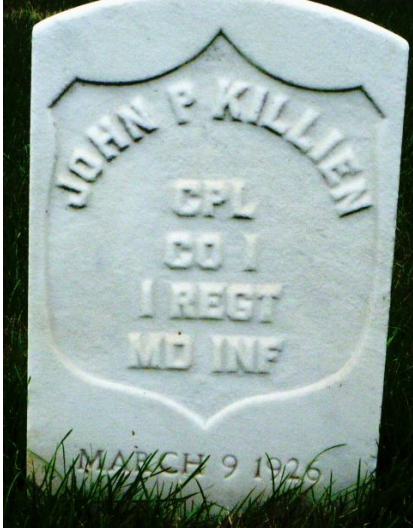
Marion Fissel d. 1896	Son of Frederick Fissel and Catherine Coyle

Catherine (Coyle) Fissel's sons, **John P. Killien** and **Frederick Frissel**, were veterans of the Spanish American War.

John P. Killien, and his wife **Annie T.**, are buried in Loudon Park National Cemetery, 3445 Frederick Avenue Baltimore, MD, Section B Site 509

Annie T. Gullivan married **John P. Killien** in 1914. Her daughter, **Agnes Gullivan**, married **William M. Mannion** in about 1916. William M. Mannion was the grandson of Catherine Coyle Fissel's sister, Mary Coyle Manion.

Frederick Frissel was Catherine Coyle Fissel's other son. He spelled his name "Frissel." Frederick got into some trouble in his early years. He committed a few crimes that resulted in jail time. Frederick is buried in Baltimore National Cemetery, 5501 Frederick Avenue, Baltimore, MD



Michael Coyle Jr. was the sixth child of Michael Coyle and Anne Tarpey. He was the 2nd son named Michael and born in Roscommon, Roscommon, Ireland. He emigrated to Baltimore, Maryland, where he married Mary Gorman McDonald in 1872. Michael died 1879, leaving behind his widow and four children. Michael Coyle Jr. was buried in St. Patrick's Cemetery. That cemetery was closed when the land was purchased by the city in 1936. The remains were moved to New Cathedral Cemetery.

After Michael Jr. died, his widow, Mary, married William Schaeffer. Three of her Coyle children died. Her oldest son, Frank Coyle survived. Mary had four children with William Schaeffer and Frank Coyle was raised with them. Frank married Theresa Hessler in 1905. Frank & Theresa are buried in New Cathedral Cemetery, Section KK 1025. There is no marker at the lot.

Mary Bridget Coyle was the third daughter and youngest child of **Michael Coyle** and **Anne Tarpay**. Mary B. also emigrated from Roscommon County, Ireland, and married Captain Charles Brown in 1873 at St. Ignatius Church in Baltimore, MD. The Browns had two sons. Charles Brown Jr. is buried with Charles Brown and Mary B. (Coyle) Brown in New Cathedral Cemetery, Section QQ, Lot 72
