

St. Thomas Aquinas, Hampden, Baltimore, MD





St Thomas Aquinas is the Roman Catholic Church in Hampden, founded in 1867. The church faces onto Hickory Avenue, between Roland Avenue and Falls Road.

William Manion's son, **Michael Manion**, moved from Grasshopper Hill to Cedar Ave. (now called Keswick Rd.) in Hampden after he married **Birdie Kone**. The Kones were members of the Woodberry Methodist Episcopal Church. Michael Manion and Birdie Kone raised their daughter, also named Birdie, as a Methodist, but both mother and daughter converted to Catholicism as is evident by their baptisms in St. Thomas Aquinas' parish records. Daughter, **Birdie Manion**, then married **Joseph Sattler**, a Catholic, in St. Thomas's Church.

John Coffay Jr. died soon after his family moved to Hampden from Grasshopper Hill. John Coffay Jr. was **William Manion's half-brother** and **Michael Manion's uncle**. His family remained in Hampden for several years and then moved to Mt Washington in Baltimore.

1925 Baptism - Joseph Sattler, son of Birdie Manion & Joseph Sattler

1927 Requiem Mass – **Birdie Kone Manion**, wife of **Michael Manion**

1932 Requiem Mass – Michael Manion, son of William Manion and Mary Coyle

1949 Requiem Mass – John Ralph Slunt, son of Catherine Coffay and Charles Slunt

1955 Requiem Mass – Catherine Slunt, daughter of Catherine Coffay & Charles Slunt
